

los Mil Días (1899-1902)."



In 2024, Dr. Jorge Camacho was awarded the prestigious Southeastern Conference Visiting Faculty Travel Grant to conduct research at the University of Florida.



During his residency, Dr. Camacho delivered a lecture titled "Slave Breeding: Medicine, Motherhood and Slavery in Colonial Cuba," and conducted archival research at the Latin American collection within the George A. Smathers Libraries. During that opportunity, he uncovered five previously unknown and uncollected poems written by two enslaved poets in Cuba.

Additionally, he discovered eleven poems by another Afro-descendant poet —a figure previously known to scholars only by an epitaph in a Cuban cemetery, but with no surviving works attributed to him. These texts, along with comprehensive scholarly analysis, will be published across three academic journals this year: *Afro-Hispanic Review*, *Ciberletras: Journal of Literary Criticism and Culture*, and *Perspectivas Afro*. Dr. Camacho wants to stress that the significance of these discoveries extends beyond literary recovery—they provide crucial insights into the little-known intellectual and creative lives of enslaved and free Afro-descendants in colonial Cuba, contributing valuable primary sources to ongoing conversations about resistance, identity, and cultural expression within the African diaspora.



Dr. Angela Acosta participated in the Congreso International Voces y cuerpos plurales: Disidencias sexuales en la cultura de la Edad de Plata hosted by the Universidad de Sevilla in Seville, Spain in June 2025. She gave a talk titled "La supervivencia sáfica contra la abnegación femenina en *Un hueco en la luz* (1947) de Amanda Junquera."

As part of her manuscript research, Dr. Acosta received a guided tour of Velintonia, the Madrid home of Spanish writers Vicente Aleixandre, Carmen Conde, and Amanda Junquera, courtesy of the Association of Friends of Vicente Aleixandre (AAVA). She looks forward to 2027 when the home will be opened as a cultural center for Spanish poetry. While in Madrid, she conducted research at the Residencia de Estudiantes Archive and the Biblioteca Nacional de España. Her research was supported by the College of Arts and Sciences Faculty Research Initiative at USC.






NEW AND FORTHCOMING

Dr. Mercedes López Rodríguez's article "Romanticism beyond the Grave: The Exhumation of Jorge Isaacs's Body and the Political Modernization of the Romantic Hero in Early Twentieth-Century Colombia" was published as part of a special issue of the Comparative Literature Journal on Sensing Migrant Romanticism.
